In Math, Kindergarten is learning about partner numbers to 10 and equations for teen numbers. They are learning that an addition equation can be written with the sum first or it can be written with the partner numbers first. Kindergarten is also working with comparing numbers. They are using vocabulary words like greater than and lesser than. Soon they will be working on our solid shapes!

Kindergarten has been talking about "Then and Now" in Social Studies. They have been learning about what it was like to live long ago! They also are having fun comparing the past, present and future!

In Reading, Kindergarten has been learning about what living things need to grow and change. They have been listening to some pretty informative stories about plants, trees and what it takes for them to grow. Kindergarten has also been working hard on their reading skills. Finding the main idea and key details in a story can be tricky, but they are doing a great job!

Finally in phonics, Kindergarten has been learning TONS!! They keep adding to our "phonics toolbox"! We have been busy reviewing our short vowel sounds as well as working on our blends!

Almost forgot!! Kindergarten started their spelling class this month, and they are doing AWESOME!! They have been working with and spelling words with short a, short e and short i.

This Month's Activities

In Phonics, we have been working on ending blends found in words. These are a little trickier than beginning blends but we are getting the hang of them. Inflectional endings, especially –ed, have been a challenge for us so far this year.

In Language, we continue to work on our non-fiction animal stories. We have also been working on verb tenses as this ties in with our Phonics lessons on inflectional endings.


In Social Studies, we have been discussing how the tools from the past differ from today's tools. We have also looked at pictures of schools and houses from long ago compared to modern ones.

In math, the 3rd graders have recently started multiplication! We will work the rest of the year on memorizing the basic one digit multiplication facts. Working on multiplication (and soon division!) flash cards at home would be a great way to work on that memorization! 2nd graders have just finished up a really long unit on subtracting. This next unit will involve clocks and various graphs. Telling time on analog clocks is another skill that can be easily worked on at home!

In English, we have been studying adjectives, and how they make our sentences more interesting. In Science we just finished up a unit on the power of water with some fun (and messy) activities about erosion!

In math, we have been working with creating different types of graphs, collecting data, comparing numbers, finding measurements, and using decimals, percentages, and fractions. In ELA, we have be working with quotations, capitalization, punctuation, and adjectives and pronouns. We have also be learning about different kinds of prefixes and suffixes as well as reading some class stories. Keep working on spelling words with your child, they have been doing a great job with them!

Science recently saw us finish a unit on waves of sound; the students got to develop cup phones, use jump ropes to show sound waves, and create their own sound codes. Lastly, in social studies, we have continued our readings and discussions about the different regions of the United States, such as the Midwest and the Southwest.
