#### This Month's Activities

Fall has officially arrived and so has the cooler weather. Please make sure your child is bringing the appropriate apparel for outdoor recess.

In Phonics, we have a good handle on the phrases used for each letter and are now starting to learn some rules of the English language. We are now starting to learn the /k/ sound and how to know when to use a "c", "k", or "-ck".

Math has been spent working on and mastering story problems. At first we really struggled knowing when to add or subtract but the more we've practiced, we've begun recognizing those clue words in the problem.

In Language, we continue working on sight words found in our Reading stories. We are working on writing our own descriptive essays all about our "wonderful worlds". The time we have spent working on common and proper nouns is coming in handy as we are writing our stories.

In Social Studies, we are working on using the cardinal directions to read a map. We have also been discussing the difference between cities, states, countries, and continents. Next up is learning how the United States became a country.

In Science, we have been studying the phases of the moon and star patterns. We used flashlights to create our own "Big Dippers".

We did not celebrate any birthdays in October and have no birthdays to celebrate in November.

#### 2nd & 3rd Grades

The chill in the air means the school year is pushing right along! With the cooler weather, please make sure your child is bringing appropriate outside clothing to school.

In math, we continue to navigate through our curriculum. Everyone seems to be adjusting well. Much of math has seemed to still be a review, but we continue to add on to our number knowledge as we work with larger numbers.

In English we are studying nouns in their various forms- common/proper; singular/plural. In our last science unit we learned about biodiversity among animals, various species, and their habitats. We are now in a lengthy social studies chapter learning how our government is set up and what it does (a difficult topic to understand- even for adults!)

In reading we continue to discuss common core standards such as main idea/details, comparing/contrasting, cause/effect, and story elements.

We will be going to the Aurora Brule Care and Rehab on Friday, Oct. 27 in the afternoon for some Halloween activities, and having our own classroom Halloween party on Tuesday, October 31.

With a change and rearrangement in staffing, we welcomed Miss Maria Barker to our classroom in the mornings!

#### 4th and 5th Grades

Hello! Crazy to think that we have reached the end of the first quarter and are rolling right into the second quarter. It was a great first quarter in 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade and I am very much enjoying my first year here at White Lake!

Students have been going through Saxon Math this year and have improved upon a number of skills. Both 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade have done a great job of reviewing their addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division skills in addition to learning new concepts. 4<sup>th</sup> grade have been working with concepts like rounding, solving patterns and word problems, and counting money. 5<sup>th</sup> grade have reviewed factors of numbers, measuring time, and making fraction graphs.

In social studies, we went over regions and geography in the United States, and have recently took tests over the States and Capitals of the United States. The students did a great job at reviewing those concepts and did very well on their tests! In science, we recently finished our unit on plants and animals and have used a number of Mystery Science activities (students made spider crawlers and did different challenges that showed how their brains work.) We are now getting started with our Unit on energy and ecosystems.

Students have done a great job of reviewing and studying their spelling words each week and I hope they continue that effort.

Additionally, we have gone over types of stories, characters, author's purpose, point of view, and theme, as well review different prefixes and suffixes.

As the weather changes and the days get colder, I remind you to make sure your students are properly dressed, comfortable, and feeling well as we begin with the second quarter. Thank you!


