


# Here's the Scoop!!

# This Month's Activities

2021 is underway and we are off to a great start so far! Please make sure your children are coming to school with hats and gloves during these cold months.

In Phonics, we have been working on ending blends found in words. These are a little trickier than beginning blends but we are getting the hang of them. We are also just beginning to work on v e words.

In Math, we have been adding and subtracting tens. We like to utilize our hundred's day chart to help us do this math. We are now starting to compare data on bar graphs.

In Reading, we studied informative writing by researching and writing about polar bears. We were amazed to learn that they don't actually have white fur but clear fur instead! We have also worked on recognizing onomatopoeia words found in stories.

In Social Studies, we are beginning a unit on comparing and contrasting the past and the present. Reading time lines help us figure out the sequence of past events.

In Science, we finished our unit on plants. Our next unit will cover the environments of different plants and animals.

# 2nd and 3rd Grades

How can it possibly be the end of January already?

In math, the 3<sup>rd</sup> graders continue to add on to their knowledge base. We continue to do daily timings to improve our fluency of multiplication facts we need to memorize. We have also started another exciting project with our facts. Every day we take a one minute timing over a set of facts. When the students master their 2s facts (multiplying 2 by numbers 2 through 12), they move onto 3s, then 4s, etc... At the end of the year, students who have mastered their facts will receive a reward. They are working toward a movie with ice cream and toppings! 2<sup>nd</sup> graders are ALSO working on their facts with these timings! They are being timed on their addition facts to help improve their fluency knowing these facts and hopefully leading to memorization instead of always relying on counting on fingers. Ask your child what number they are working on. Work with your child with flash cards to help improve their speed and accuracy (especially the 3<sup>rd</sup> graders with their multiplication!) As of right now, all students have earned the movie and are working toward their ice cream/toppings!

In English, we have moved on to a study of adjectives. In social studies we will start learning about how humans can affect the environment and what we can do through conservation of resources. In science we have just finished up a unit on Matter. We had some great conversations and a lot of fun experimenting with baking soda and vinegar to demonstrate chemical changes to matter!

In reading, we still focus on those common core standards that will be tested coming up this spring. We just finished up with our middle of the year MAPS testing, and the students have shown incredible growth!

organisms, and how energy travels through food webs and chains. In the upcoming weeks of science, the class will be starting up on Earth and Physical Science.


In social studies, the class just finished up a unit on the 13 colonies. Next up will be learning about the colonies' search for freedom and the Revolutionary War!




