Letter From the Superintendent



In Social Studies, we have been focusing on calendar skills and learning about all the different holidays. This is especially exciting with the holiday season upon us!


In Science, we are beginning a unit on plants. We are studying the different parts of a plant and the jobs they do.

Merry Christmas! We are busy wrapping up some units in order to start fresh after Christmas break. In math, the 3rd graders have just started learning the process of multiplication. The 3rd graders are to know all the one digit multiplication facts by the end of the school year.
