Letter From The Superintendent

After the last cold spell, I feel we can officially say, "Spring is in the air!" I know winter isn't officially over, but with all the sunshine we are finally getting, spring fever is setting in!

In the last newsletter, I misspoke in stating that we would not be administering a science test this spring! In correction, I will tell you that the State has applied for a waiver from the Federal level, however, no decision has been made regarding science testing yet. If the waiver is not granted, White Lake students in grades 5, 8, and 11 will also be taking the Science portion of the mandatory testing this spring.

At our last board of education meeting, there was discussion on our COVID mitigation plan. With the decreased number of positive cases in our school, county, and State, White Lake School will be easing some of the restrictions, which likely will help in the social/emotional aspects of our students. Starting the 4th quarter, March 8, classroom teachers will be allowed to utilize pods, which will certainly help in reading groups, etc. During the 15 minutes of recess, our elementary students will now be able to blend a little more together allowing them to play games that were lost over this time. Masks will still be required going through hallways and the lunch line, however, we will be going back to using our lunchroom for breakfast and lunch vs. individual classrooms.

Although we are lessening our restrictions, we will be keeping a very close eye on our students, teachers, county, and state's positive cases. If that information is telling us we are jumping the gun, we will resort back to our original plan.

Again, thank you for supporting White Lake School.


In Science, we have been talking about objects in the sky, specifically the Moon. We have also discussed gravity and how walking on the Moon would feel differently than walking on Earth.

Dodgeball Rules

- 1. Games will be played 6 on 6
 - a. No more than 4 males on the court during each match for each team
- 2. 6 balls will be used on the court during each match
- 3. Best out of 3 matches
 - a. But no more than 20 minutes if 2nd and 3rd matches are still in play when the buzzer goes off, the team with the most players on the court at that time wins the match
- 4. Players must start each match behind the end line and wait until the ref signals it is time to start
- 5. Players cannot cross the half court line if they do it will result in an out
- 6. Once a player is out, they must sit on their team's bench and wait to go back in
 - a. Players must return back into the game the order that they got out
- 7. During the game, players must remain inside the basketball court AT ALL TIMES.
 - a. Players cannot leave the court to get a ball. Teammates that are out are allowed to retrieve balls for the players still in the game
- 8. Head shots result in the player who threw the ball getting out
 - a. Headshots will be determined by the refs
- 9. If a player catchers a ball
 - a. The thrower is out
 - b. A teammate from the catcher's team can enter back into the game
- 10. Players can deflect an incoming ball with a ball already in their hands
 - a. If the ball is knocked out of their hands while blocking, they will be out
- 11. Players cannot hold the ball for more than 10 seconds
 - a. Ball must be rolled to the other team if held for more than 10 seconds
- 12. No substitutions will be allowed once a match has started, except for injuries
 - a. Substitutions can be made between matches
- 13. If the game comes down to 1 player per side, they have 10 seconds to hit each other out; if not, "Showdown" comes into effect. The game is paused, each player gets two balls, two balls are lined up at the ends of the centerline, and the centerline is dissolved. The first player to get the other player out wins
- 14. Players are expected to be honest and take themselves out if they have been hit 15. HAVE FUN!!
