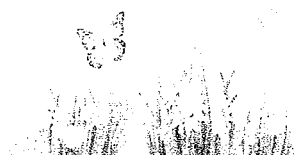

### This Month's Activities

Spring has arrived! It is crazy to think how fast this year is going. With the lovely South Dakota weather, please be sure that your child is bringing appropriate recess attire for those cooler mornings as well as the warmer afternoons.

In Phonics, we just finished working on R-controlled syllables. It can be tricky to remember if we should use "er", "ir", or "ur" when writing words! We are beginning a unit on our sixth and final commonly used vowel pattern: consonant-le. Now that we have learned the most common vowel patterns in syllables, it is really making it easier to read books independently in the classroom.

In Math, we finished a chapter on geometry. We learned all about 2D and 3D shapes. Now, we are starting a unit on measurement.

In Language, we have been working hard on correctly using commas when writing sentences, as well as writing dates. We have also been working on verb tenses. We reviewed past and present verbs and are now beginning future tense verbs.

In Social Studies, we have been identifying symbols of our country. We were lucky enough to have the ladies from the Legion Auxiliary pop into our classroom and discuss the meanings behind the colors used on the American flag. We were also able to show off our mastery of the Pledge of Allegiance!

In Science, we have been learning about different animals' habitats. Although lions and tigers are both big cats, their habitats are very different from one another. We have also been discussing and creating food chains.

In math, the 3<sup>rd</sup> graders have been working hard on learning how to divide using the multiplication facts we have been so busy working to memorize. We continue to do daily timings to improve our fluency of those multiplication facts. 2<sup>nd</sup> grade is just finishing up their math books. We will use the rest of the year to review some of the skills we need some extra practice with, as well as working on a few skills that they will start with in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade in the fall!

In social studies we will be learning about some early history of the United States. In science, we have been discussing the water cycle and weather. We have been observing the clouds to see what kinds of clouds have been in our sky, and understanding the kinds of clouds we see tells us what kind of weather we have!

In the month of March we celebrated Read Across America week by dressing up. We also took a few weeks to learn about the Iditarod race in Alaska, research the mushers, and follow them throughout the race. This was a great topic to discuss and learn about prior to running our own Iditarod!

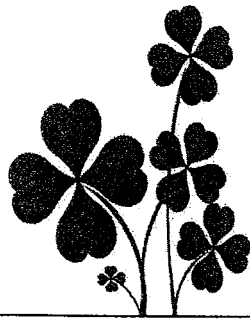

#### HOW TO PREPARE YOUR CHILD TO TAKE A TEST

Here are some things <u>your child</u> can do:	Here are some things <u>you</u> can do:
<b>REST</b> Get a good night of sleep before the test.	<b>DISCUSS</b> Help your child understand that the <i>Dakota STEP</i> gives him or her the chance to show what he or she knows about a subject.
<b>EAT</b> Eat a good breakfast.	<b>SUPPORT</b> Ask your child to maintain regular study habits. Do not ask your child to give extra study time for the <i>Dakota STEP</i> . The test covers more schoolwork than your child can learn in a few extra hours.
<b>LISTEN</b> Listen carefully to the directions given for the test and follow them exactly. If the directions are not clear, ask the teacher to repeat them or to explain them.	<b>RELAX</b> Students who are calm and sure of themselves do better on tests.
<b>TRY</b> Do your best and do not give up.

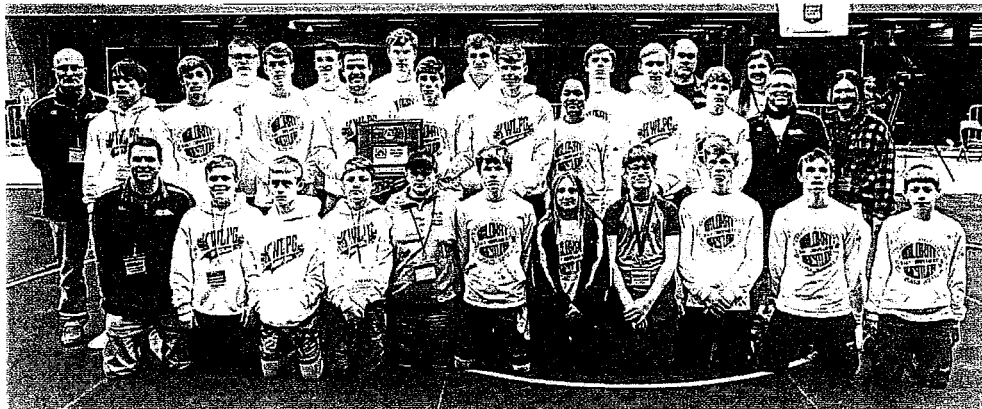
