
If your child is missing any personal belongings, make sure you check the school/classroom before the end of the school year. All extra clothing and such will be taken to Goodwill shortly after school is out.






Kindergarten Graduation

In Science, we are beginning a unit about Earth and its resources. We are discussing what geologists do and how they observe how the Earth has changed over the years.


