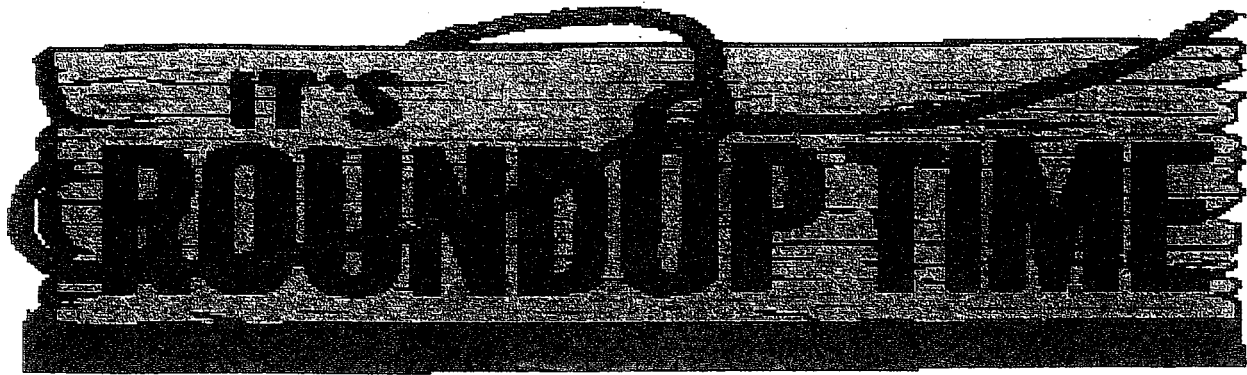
If your child is missing any personal belongings, make sure you check the school/classroom before the end of the school year. All extra clothing and such will be taken to Goodwill shortly after school is out.

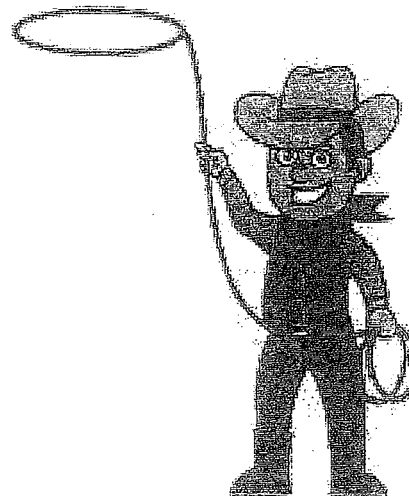
Preschool Roundup

In Social Studies, we are learning about different cultures around the world. It is interesting to see and discuss the similarities and differences between our culture and others found across the globe.

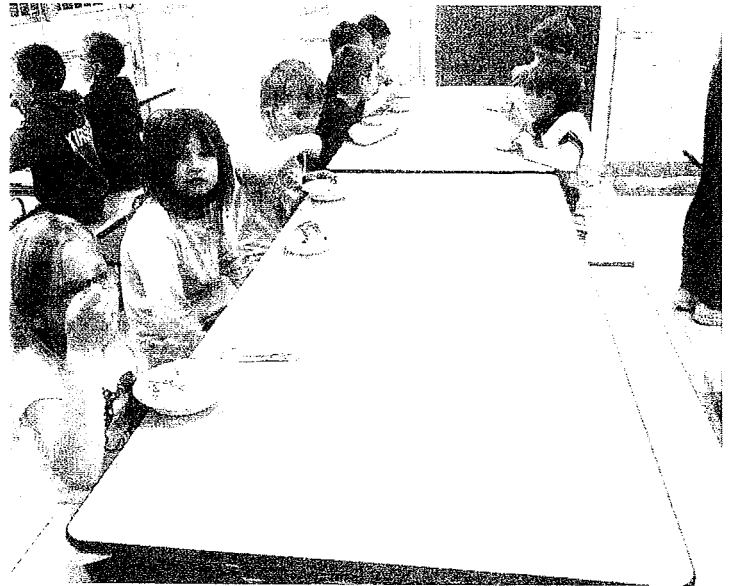
In Science, we are beginning a unit about Earth and its resources. We are discussing what geologists do and how they observe how the Earth has changed over the years.

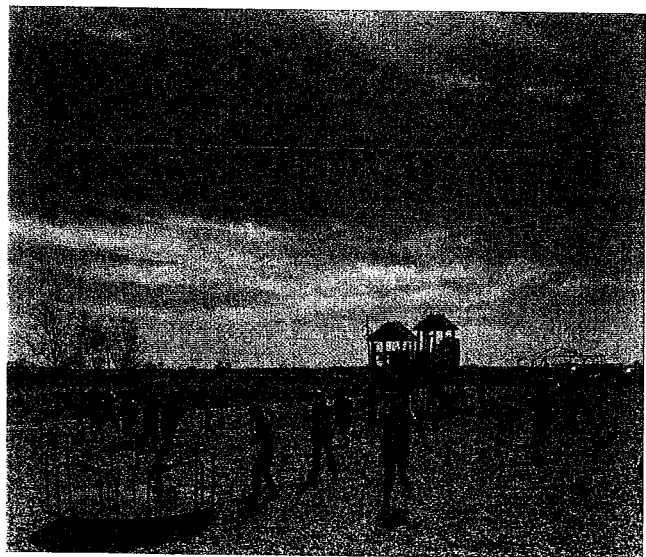

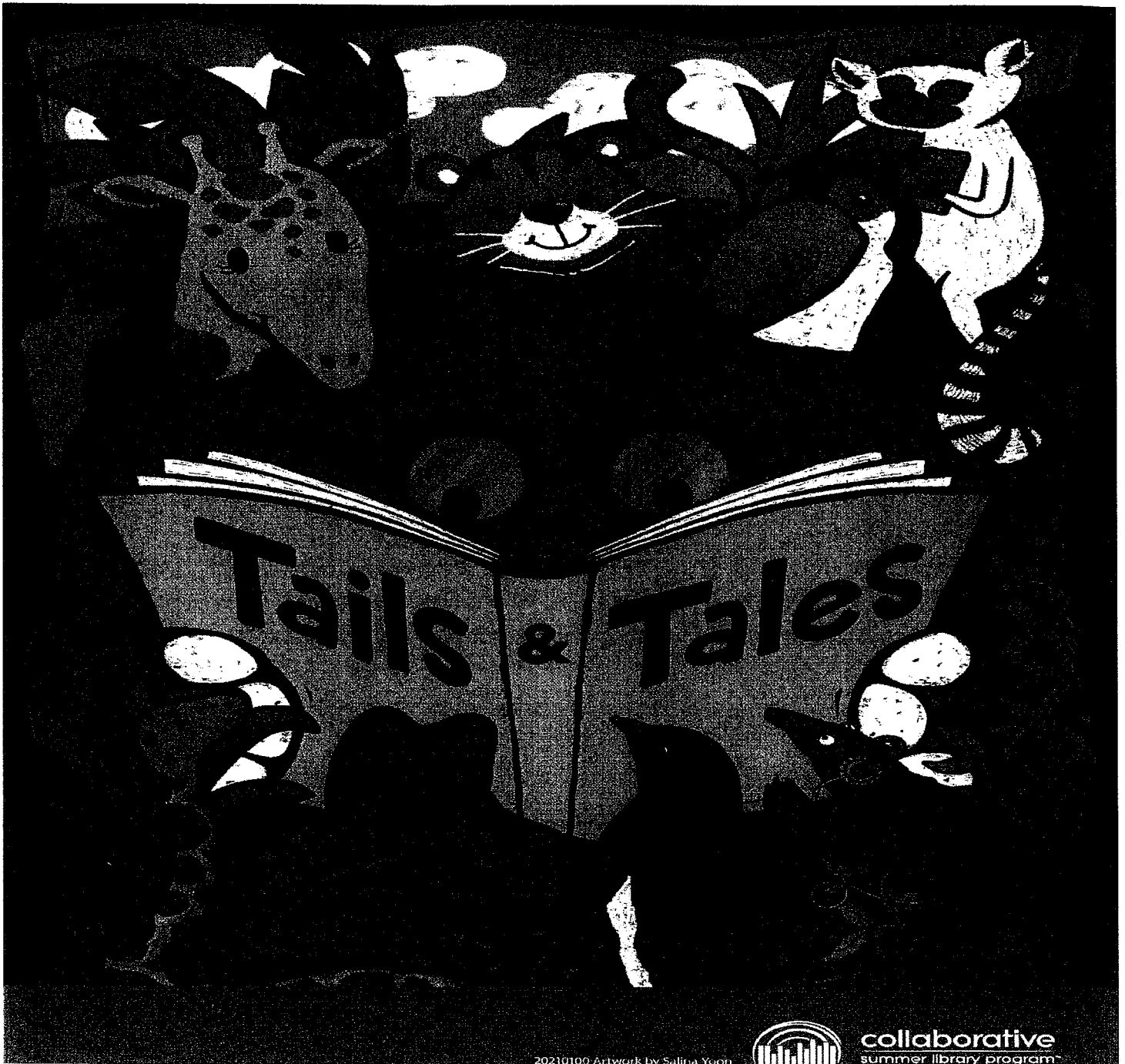
Picture Below

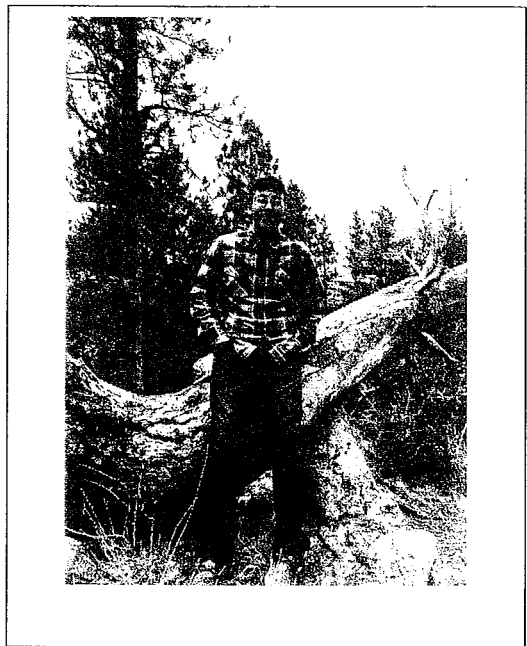
