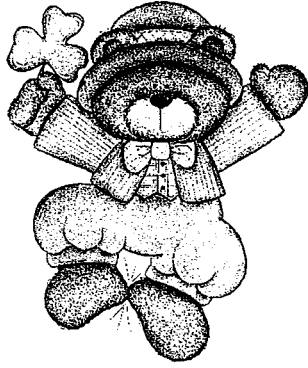

In Math, Kindergarten is learning tons about our addition and subtraction. They have been spending lots of time working on finding different ways to make numbers. Kindergarten has also been working on story problems and building numbers beyond 20.

Kindergarten has been talking about land, water, regions, cities, farms, suburbs. You name it, we have talked about it! We even talked about the different types of shelters that you would see in the different regions!

In Reading, Kindergarten has been talking about everything animals! We read a story called, Zooborns. We had fun reading and learning about the different kinds of zoo babies. 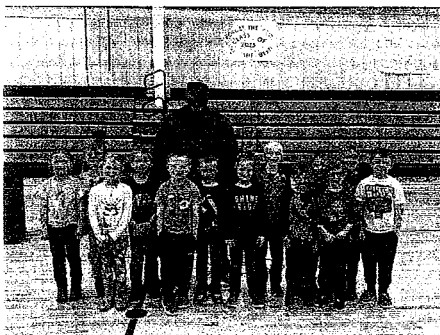

### This Month's Activities

Spring has arrived! It is crazy to think how fast this year is going. With the lovely South Dakota weather, please be sure that your child is bringing appropriate recess attire for those cooler mornings as well as the warmer afternoons.

In Phonics, we just finished working on R-controlled syllables. It can be tricky to remember if we should use "er", "ir", or "ur" when writing words! We are beginning a unit on our sixth and final commonly used vowel pattern: consonant-le. Now that we have learned the most common vowel patterns in syllables, it is really making it easier to read books independently in the classroom.

In Math, we finished a unit on time. We are now learning about 2D and 3D shapes. Next, will be a unit on measurement.

In Language, we have been working on pronouns. We have mastered subject pronouns and will now be starting on object pronouns. We have also started working on poetry and will be writing our own nature poems.

In Social Studies, we are finishing up a unit on comparing past civilizations to present ones. We have also been discussing how technology has helped improve transportation.

In Science, we have continued to watch our green bean plant "Ferdinand" grow. It is very neat to see how the roots have spread out! Soon we will be starting some science experiments using Peeps. Thanks to all those who have been able to donate!

Can you believe that we are already in the fourth quarter and nearing summer? This semester sure seemed to fly right on by! Our fourth and fifth grade classes are fast approaching the yearly Smarter Balanced Testing. Parents, the schedule will be in this newsletter if you have not already found it. Please follow the tips given about preparing your child at home for this.

In the classroom, we are nearing the end of our math books and learning many new skills. These include fraction work (multiplying, dividing, equivalent fractions), long division and multiplication, statistics, and geometric skills. In ELA, we are continuing to read our curriculum while practicing reading and writing skills such as main idea, details, summarizing, etc.

The students are also learning more spelling words and vocabulary words as well as more about parts of speech and grammar skills, such as verbs, objects, clauses, and prepositional phrases. In social studies, the class recently finished their books about the United States geography, including states, capitals, and abbreviations. The class became mini geographers with their ending knowledge of the United States map! Over half of the class finished with knowing ALL 50 of the states, capitals, and/or abbreviations. Lastly, in science, the class just started learning about electricity. To end the year, we will review life science concepts.

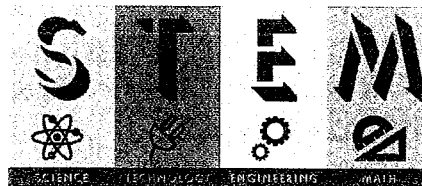
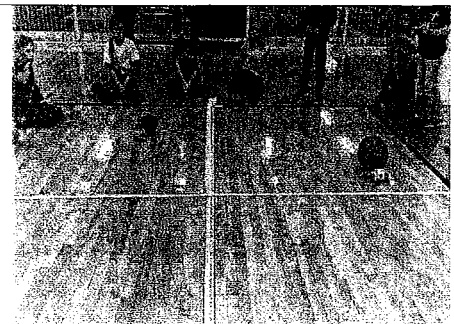

<b>EAT</b>  Eat a good breakfast.	<b>SUPPORT</b>  Ask your child to maintain regular study habits. Do not ask your child to give extra study time for the <i>Dakota STEP</i> . The test covers more schoolwork than your child can learn in a few extra hours.
<b>LISTEN</b>  Listen carefully to the directions given for the test and follow them exactly. If the directions are not clear, ask the teacher to repeat them or to explain them.	<b>RELAX</b>  Students who are calm and sure of themselves do better on tests.
<b>TRY</b>  Do your best and do not give up.

Happy Spring,

Greetings from the White Lake Avera Clinic. Each year we like to reach out to our families with children who are due for mandatory school vaccinations or who may need sports physicals for the upcoming year. This year, we are encouraging you to book your appointments within the months of May and June; Tia will be out of the office starting July 1<sup>st</sup>. For your convenience, we have included a copy of your child's current vaccination record indicating which vaccinations he/she will need.

Almost all insurances will cover vaccinations and a child well check. If a sports physical is needed, it will be booked under a child well check. Insurances can vary, however, on the timing and coverage of a well check. For instance, some insurances will cover one well check or physical per calendar year, some need to be booked a year apart to the day.

\* Please make sure you are familiar with your insurance coverage. We encourage you to call your insurance company to make sure your child's physical will be covered on the day you want to book. \*\* Clinic staff will not know if your child's physical will be covered but we can confirm the last date of each physical with our clinic.

If you do not carry insurance or if your child has already had his/her well check for the year, we will collect \$45 at the time of the physical.



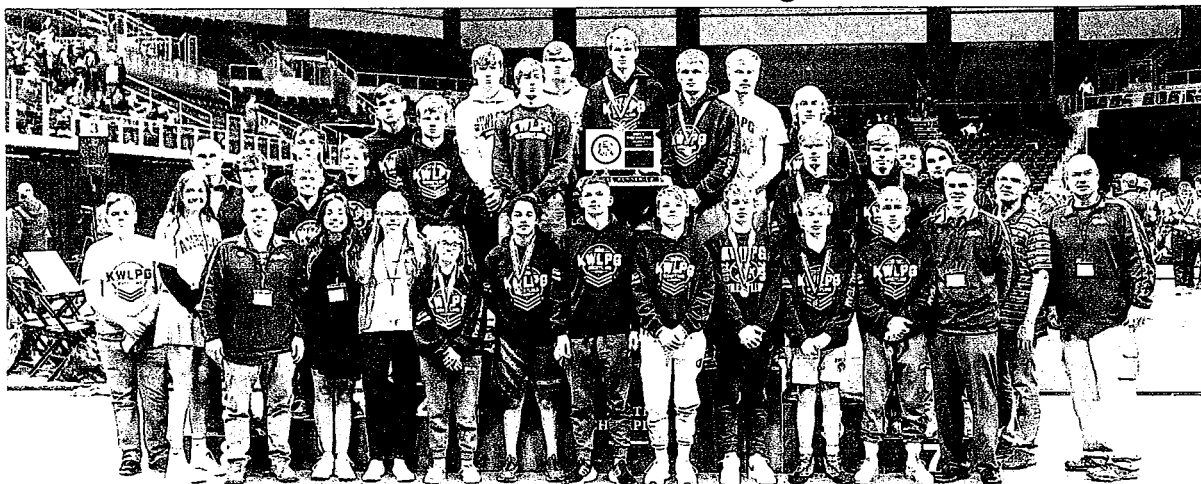
