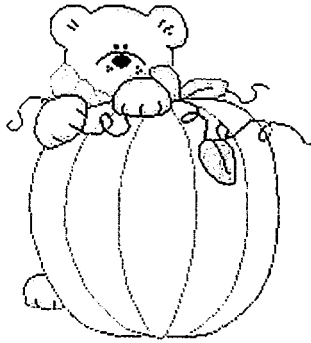

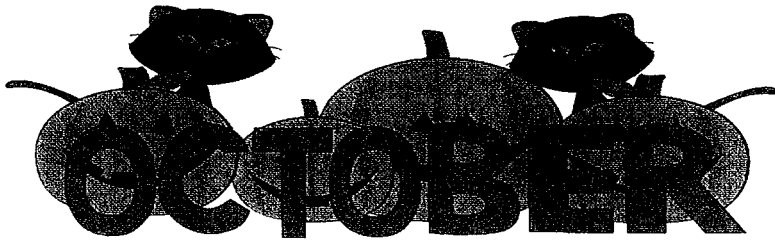
Surprise visitors!

In Phonics, we have a good handle on the phrases used for each letter and are now starting to learn some rules of the English language. We have been working on the /k/ sound and how to know when to use a "c", "k", or "-ck".

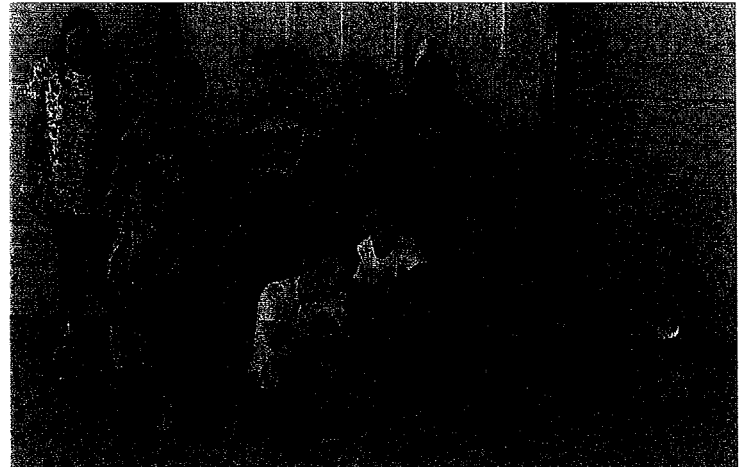
In Social Studies, we are working on using the cardinal directions to read a map. We have also been discussing the difference between cities, states, countries, and continents.

In Science, we are working on a unit about materials. We are learning the difference between natural and human-made materials.

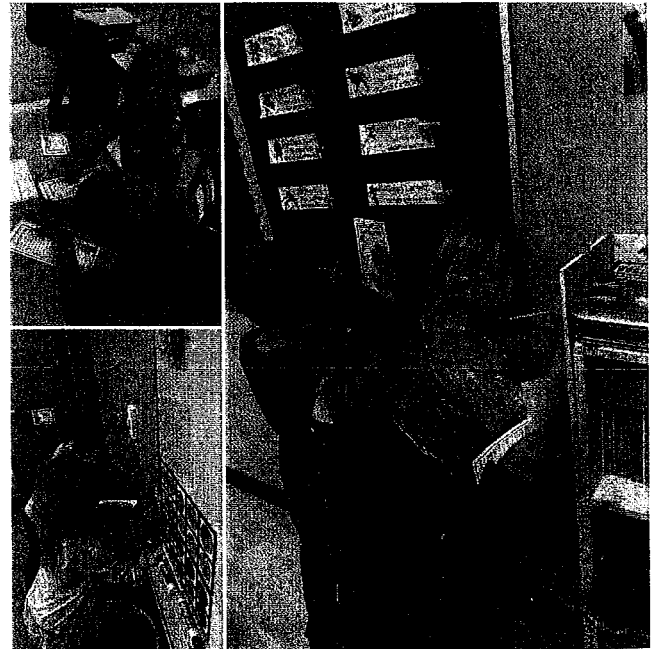
We did not celebrate any birthdays in October. In November, we will celebrate Dempsey turning 7 years old.

2nd & 3rd Grades

The chill in the air means the school year is pushing right along! With the cooler weather, please make sure your child is bringing appropriate outside clothing to school.

In math, we continue to navigate through our curriculum. Everyone seems to be adjusting well. While some concepts are a simple review, others are new! 2nd grade has tackled concepts like adding 2 digit numbers with regrouping and counting nickels and dimes. 3rd grade has covered topics such as adding/subtracting with money, regrouping/exchanging (mostly money also), and now reading “big” numbers up to 999,999!

In English we are studying nouns and trying to figure out when to capitalize for proper nouns. We are studying the changes in matter from a solid to a liquid to a gas in Science. When we finish this unit, we will be studying the branches of government and what role they play in social studies

In reading we continue to discuss common core standards such as main idea/details, figurative language, point of view, and author’s purpose.

We will finish off the month with a class Halloween party.

Well we survived through the first quarter of school! Some days it seemed to have flown by while there were days that seemed to have drug on. I know the kids felt this way too! Soon enough, it will be Thanksgiving and Christmas!

We have made tremendous progress so far in the year. A big chunk of their science in the last few weeks has been filled with all things solar system. This turned into a two-part research project for the students. The final part of their project has been taking all of their information and publishing it into an online book. The students have been hard at work putting their typing and writing skills into action. In addition, the students will use this site to record their book. Once complete, links will be sent to parents for them to get to enjoy listening and looking at their kids' research books. Next up in science is physical science! In social studies, we will be diving into the different regions of the United States and studying the geography and brief history of the area. Next semester, we will focus more on the history and development of South Dakota.

In math, we are finally getting into brand new skills such as multiplying and dividing with the fourth grade. The fifth grade has refined their division skills. Coming up, they will be busy learning more multiplication as well as some statistics. In ELA, we have been busy getting acclimated to our new curriculum. We have continued to practice our reading skills as reviewing some phonics skills to decode and spell words.
