

### Learning the Basics in Kindergarten

We have started our year learning lots of things. We have started out reviewing all our letters. Now we are learning the sounds the letters make. We have been learning the letters m, a and s! We also have a new phonics program this year called, "Countdown". We enjoy all the different activities.

We completed a Social Studies unit discussing the rules and laws found within our society. We have been perfecting skills, such as cause and effect and map reading, as well.



# 2nd and 3rd Grades

How is it already the middle of September!? We have been in full swing for a month now and have made a great transition into the school year!

The 3<sup>rd</sup> graders have adjusted well to their "new" math series, having to copy from the text book. The 2<sup>nd</sup> graders have spent their math time mostly review basic adding/subtracting facts. Most of the remainder of this first chapter for them is reading story problems and finding key words to help them decide whether to add or subtract.

In English, we are studying sentences and the parts that make a whole sentence. In social studies, we learned about what makes a good citizen. We also learned a bit about some good citizens in history. In science, we are using an online curriculum composed of videos and hands on activities. We are currently studying the way scientists have classified animals into groups!
