
We have working A LOT with our letters lately! We have been blending them together, writing them, stretching them! Who knew you could do so many things with them! Oh yeah, we read them too!

In Reading, we continue to work on our fluency and reading comprehension skills. We have been reading many stories and discussing whether the author's purpose is to entertain or to inform.





We will be starting a science unit on fossils and what evidence they provide to the past.


In reading we continue to learn and apply reading skills. We just learned about nonfiction text and graphic features by exploring through nonfiction books and encyclopedias.





AN EXPERIENCE IN DEMOCRACY

Each year the White Lake American Government class is in charge of a mock election and this year was no different. Students in grades 6-12 and staff were invited to vote on candidates and issues on the real ballot—though we had our own version. Results were strongly in favor of the Republican candidates across the board. About 3/4 of our voters were in favor of Constitutional



Amendment D (Medicaid expansion). Initiated Measure 27 (legalized marijuana) was also favored but by only a small margin.


The senior class also comes up with ideas for initiated measures on their own. Apparently their ideas must have sounded pretty good to our voters since each of them passed with about a three to one majority of the votes. These ideas have absolutely no bearing on policy in school or elsewhere; they are purely an exercise in how government works.


Initiated measure #1 would have changed our school day to run from 8am to 4pm Monday through Thursday. Students with grades below a C- would have to report to school on Friday from 8am to noon with teachers having two assigned Fridays per quarter to be in school working with those students.

#2 would have required out-of-state auditers to pay an additional \$30 fee per day if they were hunting through a lodge. This revenue would have been used to provide additional pheasants in that county for the following pheasant season.

Super Bowl Monday as a new national holiday was the third initiative proposed by the seniors. Wearing your team's colors that day would be encouraged even if they were not the winners of the Super Bowl.

Hopefully students gained some insight into the election process by participating in the vote that day!
