
### Here's the Kindergarten Scoop!!

In Reading, we continue to work on our fluency and reading comprehension skills. We have been reading many stories and discussing whether the author's purpose is to entertain or to inform.



## 2nd & 3rd Grades

It is hard to believe we are nearing on half of the school year being complete!

In math, the 3<sup>rd</sup> graders continue to add new skills, most recently working with fractions. 2<sup>nd</sup> graders have been working on counting dollars and coins. We will be moving into subtraction with regrouping; always a tricky skill to master! Working at home with your child on flash cards to increase their knowledge and fluency will help! The basic facts are something they will *need* to know.

### We are Working On...

### English Language Arts:

We have been doing a lot of grammar skills in the last few weeks including subjects, predicates, comma usage, capitalization usage, clauses, conjunctions, and types of sentences.

For reading, we have continued to work through our curriculum for reading of stories as well as practicing and focusing on key reading skills such as point of view, purpose, plot elements, context clues, citing evidence, and figurative language.

### Writing:

For Thanksgiving, our class did a persuasive writing from the point of view of a turkey not wanting to be eaten on Thanksgiving. Instead, students needed to create arguments as to why they should not be eaten as well as an argument piece with details about what should be eaten instead of the traditional turkey.

### Math:

Both classes have really gotten into completely new skills in math. The fifth grade has begun working more with fractions and multiplying them, expanded notation, mixed numbers, and converting different units of measurement. For the fourth grade, the class has really picked up their usage of multiplying. We are in the process of learning how to multiply with multi-digit numbers.

### Science/Social Studies:

The class recently finished learning about the Northeast region, including its history. They have also learned about the location of states, capitals, and abbreviations. Next up is learning about the Southeast history, geography, and states!


In Science, we are nearing the beginning of learning about the phases of matter, changes in matter, and their properties.


