

This Month's Activities


We are still focusing on our daily routines in and out of the classroom. We have been working on the "Days of the Week" and "Months of the Year" during our morning group time.

Apple Picking Time!




In Social Studies, we are working on using the cardinal directions to read a map. We have also been discussing the difference between cities, states, countries, and continents.

In Science, we have been studying the phases of the moon. We used flashlights to create our own "Big Dippers"


We did not celebrate any birthdays in October. In November, we will celebrate Lewis turning 7 years old.

2nd & 3rd Grades


The chill in the air means the school year is pushing right along! With the cooler weather, please make sure your child is bringing appropriate outside clothing to school.



Fourth and Fifth Grade



CLASSROOM HAPPENINGS

The fourth and fifth grade classes have been zooming right along with their learning and work throughout October. A big portion of ELA this month has been designated to bettering ourselves as writers. After learning about the skills of writing, students spent a few days planning out a realistic Halloween-based story using those newly learned skills such as characterization, plot development, descriptive wording, etc. After we planned, students then went into the writing process of writing a rough draft, peer revisions. editing, and creating a final draft.

The fourth and fifth graders have also been practicing math skills as well as beginning to learn some new skills. The fourth graders have been learning and practicing multiplication while the fifth grade has been working and learning more about fractions. This includes adding, subtracting, and reducing fractions.


In social studies, the students are finishing up a unit learning about the early Native American tribes found in North America. Afterwards, they will be reading and learning about the European explorers that ventured over to North America that eventually

started the process of America becoming America.


Lastly, in science, we will be moving onto a unit about Earth Science. This will include learning about Earth itself and its water cycle, Earth's layers, atmospheric layers, etc. The typical student favorite unit of the solar system will also be taught during this unit.

6th Grade Social Studies

In sixth grade Social Studies, we are deepening our understanding of the Earth and its peoples through the study of history, geography, politics, culture, and economic systems. We have studied about the Stone Ages and Early Cultures, including the hunter-gatherers, the ice ages, and early human migration. We went on to learn about the beginnings of agriculture during the Neolithic Era and how agriculture changed societies. Did you know that agriculture was the main reason that cities grew because they could control their own food production and had enough food to feed their population? They were able to build permanent housing and stay in one place because of agriculture. We have just finished a chapter on Mesopotamia and the Fertile Crescent and learned that the Mesopotamians were the first to build canals and use irrigation to control the flooding during the rainy season and provide enough water during the dry season. Because irrigation made farms more productive, fewer people needed to farm. As a result, new occupations developed. People became crafters, religious leaders, and government workers. We also learned that the Sumerians developed cuneiform, the world's first system of writing, and they were also the inventors of the wheel. Because of this invention, they went on to invent the plow and the potter's wheel. Math and Science was another area in which Sumerians excelled. They developed a math system based on the number 60 (60 seconds in a minute, 60 minutes in an hour, 360 degrees in a circle). Next, we will be learning about Ancient Egypt and Kush. During this chapter, we will be making papyrus paper from large brown paper grocery bags. If you have any paper large brown paper bags on hand, we would greatly appreciate your donations for this project. Either give them to a 6th grade student or to Mrs. Nightingale. Thank you!


